## **BEST PRACTICES**

### **Bridge Course**

Orientation and Bridge Course are conducted for the first year students before the commencement of Academics. The purpose of this course is to bridge the gap between their school and College curriculum. A pre-test and post-test is conducted to analyze the impact of Bridge Course and categorize the students as slow, medium and fast learners and coach them accordingly.

### **Tutor Ward System and Mentoring**

It helps in supporting and encouraging the wards to manage and enrich their learning and feel more confident and self-supporting. All the students are segregated on 20:1 ratio. Each 20 students are being under one Mentor, Mentors take care of their wards in Academic, Personal, Career, Psycho-Social aspects.

### **Out Bound Training Facilities**

Nehru Outbound for Leadership Excellence (NOBLE) is the largest OBT facility in Private Sector in India. It is spread over 3 acres with the capacity to accommodate 120 students to stay and get trained. It helps students to unleash the hidden potential and help them to reinvent themselves.

At NOBLE, we firmly believe that the traits can be learnt best in outbound programmes than in class room. This facilitates an inner view of student's strengths and limitations, there by leading them to powerful individuals.

### **Skill Based Value Added Courses**

The Department signs a MoU with the Industries to offer Add-on courses. These MoU also helps our students in Placements. The Company which offers Add on programme ensures 10% placement for the students they train. Certificates are issued at the end of the course.

### **Industrial Visit**

Industrial Visit is organized for the students to visit companies and get insight regarding the internal working environment of a company. Any Student who goes for Industrial Visit should submit the consent letter from their parents.

### **Modern Infrastructure**

NASC offers excellent infrastructure to support academic and holistic development. The campus is well-equipped with hostels, canteens, seminar halls, small-scale production units, safe drinking water, restrooms and reliable power plants. Spacious

playgrounds facilitate athletics, cricket, football, hockey, volleyball and badminton. In addition, a fully equipped gymnasium, yoga centre, and auditorium promote physical fitness, wellness and cultural enrichment.

### Technology-Enabled Learning

The classrooms are well-ventilated and equipped with modern teaching aids and digital learning facilities. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled with up to 50 Mbps bandwidth, ensuring uninterrupted internet access across classrooms, laboratories, library, departmental offices and hostels, thereby supporting continuous academic engagement.



### Central Library

The NASC Central Library, located in the main block and spread over 2000 sq. ft., houses a rich collection of 39,326 books, 2318 CDs, journals, and magazines covering literature, sciences, arts, history, and social sciences. Fully automated with Auto Lib Software (v5.1), the library offers OPAC services, barcode-based circulation, reprographic facilities, and internet-enabled systems. It accommodates over 100 readers and is equipped with CCTV surveillance and fire safety devices.

## Student Ministry

Student Ministry play a vital role in both the academic and administrative spheres of our institution. They are actively involved in major institutional bodies such as the Governing Body, IQAC, Alumni Association, Fine Arts Committee, Sports and Cultural Committees, Grievance Cell, and other subcommittees. Acting as a bridge between the student community and the Management, they ensure effective communication and representation. To ensure inclusive governance, a structured Student Cabinet has been formed with 14 distinct ministries. This Cabinet empowers students to take part in the institution's daily operations. Selection of ministers is done through a four-stage process comprising a written test, group discussion, presentation, and final interview, based on skill alignment to each portfolio.

The ministry include Education, Research, Information Technology, Public Relation, Human Resource, Health, Fine Arts, Transport, Finance, External Affairs, Environment, Law & Order, Innovation & Production, Sports. Each ministry is led by a Minister, supported by a Secretary, Executive Head and seven Executive Members from different departments, totaling 140 members. They work collaboratively to enhance the campus environment and support staff and students. This system cultivates leadership, administrative competence, and decision-making abilities among students.

## Ragging is Banned

Nehru Arts and Science College strictly adheres to the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) regarding prevention and prohibition of ragging in all forms.

**As per the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, ragging in any form, within or outside the college campus, is strictly prohibited and punishable.**

## Punishments for Ragging

**The UGC regulations stipulate that students can be expelled from an institute and debarred from taking admission to any other institute for a specified period after being found guilty of the offence.**

As per the regulations any students can be fined up to Rs. 2.5 Lakhs if found guilty of ragging. The UGC regulations provide for justification of a student, a period from one to four semesters.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following :

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for periods ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
10. Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 2.5 lakh
11. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

## EXAMINATION SYSTEM

The examination in each Theory and Practical courses consist of two parts:

- Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) carrying maximum of Theory 25% marks and Practical 40% marks.
- End of Semester Examinations (ESE) covering the whole syllabus prescribed for the paper carrying maximum of Theory 75%, and Practical 60% marks.

The Controller of Examinations (CoE) will conduct all End Semester Examinations and issue mark statements with requisite security features. Bharathiar University will issue the final degree. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) shall be performed by the Course Teachers based on the regulations.

## CONTINUOUS INTERNALASSESSMENT (CIA) TESTS

Three CIA's tests shall be conducted at regular Intervals.

- CIA I & II shall be 2 hours written test for a maximum of 50 marks each. The portion shall be II Units per CIA.
- CIA III shall be conducted as Model Examination for ESE.

## PASSING MINIMUM

### UG Programmes

A candidate who secures **not less than 40%** in the End Semester Examination and 40% marks in the External Examination and Continuous Internal Assessment put together in any theory course of Part I, II, III & IV shall be declared to have passed the examination in the subject (Theory and Practical).

### PG Programmes

A candidate who secures **not less than 50%** in the End Semester Examination and 50% marks in the External examination and Continuous Internal Assessment put together in any courses shall be declared to have passed the examination in the subject (Theory and Practical).

### ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

The guidelines of attendance requirement issued by Bharathiar University are adopted by the College. Attendance shall be considered semester- wise (not annually). The details of Candidates falling under different Categories based on the attendance are as follows.

Proforma	Details
I	Candidates who have earned 75% of attendance and more in the current semester and eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects.
II	Candidates who have earned 65% to 74% of attendance and more in the current semester and eligible for condonation and to write the examination in current semester subjects
III	Candidates who have earned 50% to 64% of attendance and not eligible for condonation. Candidates given in this proforma are not eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects but are permitted to continue their studies in the next semester provided that this is the first time that the candidate earned attendance between 50% and 64%. Else the candidates have to discontinue the course and re-join in the same semester subjects in the next year with proper approval of the Registrar. However, the candidates are eligible to write arrear subjects if any.

IV	Candidates who have earned attendance 49% and below. Candidates given in this proforma shall discontinue the course and re-join in the same semester in the next year with proper approval of the Registrar. They are not eligible for condonation and to write the current semester papers but are eligible to write arrear papers.
V	Candidates who have earned 50% to 64% of attendance in the previous semester and have now earned combined attendance 75% and more in this semester. Candidates given in this proforma are eligible to write the exam in the current semester and previous semester subjects.
VI	Candidates who have earned 50% to 64% of attendance in the previous semester and have now earned combined attendance between 65% and 75% and eligible for condonation by the Principal.
VII	Candidates who have earned 50% to 64% of attendance in the previous semester and have now earned combined attendance 64% and below and not compensated the shortage in attendance. Candidates failing under this category shall discontinue the course and rejoin the course in next academic year in the Previous semester in which the candidate had the first shortage of attendance. They are eligible to appear for arrear subjects and shall not appear for the current and previous semester subjects.
VIII	Candidates who are eligible to appear for current semester subjects (ie., whose names are given in proforma I, II, V, VI) but did not pay exam fees and register for current semester regular subjects.

- **Avoid use, possession, or influence** of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or any intoxicants.
- **No political, caste-based, or religious activities** that disturb college harmony.
- **Don't engage in cyberbullying, defamation, or social media misconduct.**
- **ObeY the instructions of faculty and administrative staff** at all times.
- **Avoid bringing unauthorized guests** or outsiders without permission.
- **Park vehicles only in designated zones** and always wear helmets if riding two-wheelers.
- **Participate in co-curricular and extension activities** actively and responsibly.
- **Use dustbins and maintain cleanliness;** plastic usage on campus is discouraged.
- **Switch off lights and fans** when leaving classrooms or labs.
- **Respect nature and green practices** adopted by the college.
- **Do not misuse social media or spread false information** related to the institution.
- **Violation of the code may lead to disciplinary action,** including warning, suspension, or expulsion.

## **ADMISSIONS AND WITHDRAWALS**

- All admissions into the College are made as per the guidelines of Bharathiar University and Government of Tamil Nadu.
- Application for admission into the College should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the College office.
- Normally, admissions are done only once in a year in the beginning of the academic year.
- Details regarding eligibility for admission, documents to be submitted, fees to be paid, etc., are given in the prospectus issued along with the Application Form.
- Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
- If a student is absent without a valid reason and the leave letter for more than continuous five days from the date of admission or reopening of the College whichever is later, the student's name will be removed from the Register.
- If a student leaves the College in the middle of any semester, he/she cannot claim remission of any Portion of the fees.
- Students who have completed their course of studies, can get their Transfer and Conduct Certificates after clearing the dues to the Laboratories, Library & Examination Cell by submitting a written application to the Principal.
- If a student leaves the College at the end of an academic year, he/she can receive the Attendance Certificate required by the University if he/she applies for it.

## **ATTENDANCE & LEAVE**

- Students should attend the classes regularly.
- Attendance is marked for each period at the commencement of the class.
- University and College rules require **REGULAR ATTENDANCE** in all classes

both theory and practical.

- Absence during one period in any session is treated as absent for half-a-day.
- In case of absence on medical reasons, the student should produce a Medical Certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- The leave application should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the office / departments.
- The leave application with the counter signatures of the Parent/Guardian, the Tutor (and the Deputy Warden, in case of hostel students) should be submitted in advance or on the first day of return to the College.
- The monthly statement of attendance will be displayed on the Department Notice Board by the respective Department within the first five working days every month in a semester.
- To appear for the University / Autonomous Examinations, a student has to:
  - Earn 75% of attendance for each semester and that attendance reckoned in terms of day only and not subject-wise.
  - Satisfy the College by his / her conduct and progress.
  - Perform all the experiments laid down in subject practicals, making a proper record of each before starting the next.
- The Principal is authorized to condone deficiency in attendance upto a maximum of 10% of the number of days for each semester.
- Only 15 days will be permitted as on duty for students who represent the college in NCC, NSS, YRC, PYE, RRC, ECC, WEC and other extra curricular activities, which will not be included under the minimum eligibility of attendance (75%) appearing for the examinations.
- The Principal may take appropriate disciplinary action in case of continued violation of leave rules.

## **HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATION**

- Rules and Regulations of the Hostel
- Students are advised to go home only with the Parents/Guardians
- Outing is strictly not permitted for the students during exam period
- Roll call will be at **07.00 pm** every day
- Strictly adhere to studies between **09.00 pm to 11.00 pm**
- Hostel Main Gate will remain closed from **06.00 pm. to 05.30 am.**
- Inmates should be modestly dressed
- Should maintain discipline and decorum
- They should not indulge in ragging
- Day scholars/No visitors are entertained inside the hostel premises

- Wastage of Water and Electricity must be avoided
- The inmates should keep their rooms and surroundings clean and neat
- Rooms allotted to the inmates are not interchangeable
- Prior permission must be obtained from the warden for Outing and going home with the knowledge of the Department Authorities
- The Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) will take the full responsibility for permitting the students from the hostels
- The Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) will forward the students permission forms to the Chief Warden for the approval
- Whenever, any of the Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) apply leave, they must make alternate arrangements with any one of the available Deputy Chief Wardens with the knowledge of the Chief Warden
- While entering and leaving the hostel, students must register their names in the hostel's login register
- They should strictly adhere to dining hours: Breakfast: 07.30 - 09.00 am, Lunch: 12.15 - 01.30 pm, Dinner: 07.00 - 08.30 pm
- The decision of the Chief Warden will be the final. Violation of Hostel rules will lead to punishment and dismissal from the Hostel/ College
- Students may be expelled from the Hostel on any one of the following grounds: Theft, Ragging, Abnormal behaviour, Usage of intoxicants, Indiscipline, Violation of rules and non-payment of fees. If the student is expelled on disciplinary grounds, they shall forfeit fee and the deposit

## **TRANSPORT RULES AND REGULATION**

- Only students who have registered for the college transport service and paid the prescribed transport fee are permitted to use the college buses.
- All students must carry their valid Bus RF ID Card while travelling on the college bus and produce it whenever requested by Bus Coordinator or college authorities.
- Students should board and alight only at designated stops and follow instructions from the driver or Bus Coordinator.
- All students are required to download, install and use the Neo Track AI Tracking App for tracking bus movements, viewing arrival timings and receiving transport-related notifications.
- Students shall travel only on the bus route, boarding point and drop-off point allotted to them by the Transport Department. Any change must be approved by the Transport Office.

- Students must report to their designated boarding points at least 10 minutes before the scheduled arrival time of the bus. The bus will not wait for late arrivals.
- Students shall maintain proper discipline and decorum while travelling. Any form of misconduct, use of abusive language, quarrelling, or behaviour causing inconvenience to others is strictly prohibited.
- Standing on footboards, leaning out of windows, or engaging in any unsafe activity is strictly prohibited.
- Students shall not damage, deface, or misuse any part of the bus, including seats, windows, doors, and other fittings. Any damage caused shall be recovered from the concerned student(s).
- Students shall maintain cleanliness inside the bus and shall not litter, spit or dispose of waste improperly.
- The following are strictly prohibited:
  - Smoking, vaping, or consumption of tobacco products.
  - Carrying or consuming alcohol or prohibited substances.
  - Playing loud music or causing disturbances.
  - Any act that compromises the safety and comfort of passengers.
- Students must cooperate with the driver and the bus coordinator during emergencies and follow all safety instructions issued by the college.
- The Transport Department may conduct surprise inspections to verify bus passes, student identity and compliance with transport regulations.
- Cancellation of the college bus facility during the middle of a semester is strictly not permitted.
- Failure to comply with these rules may result in disciplinary action, including suspension of transport privileges.
